- The 'JVMOHR' is an open-access international journal that publishes high-quality original articles on all aspects of Veterinary medical sciences and technology, and the veterinary and human medical research associated with the 'One Health' perspective.
- The Editorial Board of the 'JVMOHR' invites authors from all over the world to contribute their innovative and quality research and findings.

TYPES OF PAPER

- Review
- Case report
- Submitted manuscripts are pre-screened by the editorial office to check that they agree with the criteria for publishing in the 'JVMOHR.'
- The author submitting the paper will be asked to confirm that the article is original and is not being considered for peer-reviewed publication elsewhere.
- Authors should avoid plagiarism in the manuscript in any form.
- Original article
- Book review
- Short communication
- Letter to Editor

MANUSCRIPT FORMAT

- 6.5 × 8.5 inch (in A4 paper size)
- Double space typed
- 12-Point Time New Roman font
- 1-inch (2.5 cm) margins
- With justification
- Sequential line numbering

ORGANIZATION AND CONTENTS

1. TITLE

- The manuscript title must appear on the title page and be succinct and informative.
- The title should be limited to 25 words, and it should not contain any abbreviations.

2. AUTHORSHIP

- The author's name(s), academic mailing address and e-mail address of the first author to whom correspondence should be addressed must be provided.
- Each individual listed as an author must have participated sufficiently to take public responsibility for the work.

3. ABSTRACT

- All manuscripts must include a brief abstract (≤ 300 words).
- The abstract should be a single paragraph and the classified format of abstract should contain a description of the study (a) background, (b) purpose /objective, (c) materials and methods used, (d) significant results obtained and (d) the conclusions of primary interest.

4. KEYWORDS

- The best and appropriate keywords should be provided in the manuscript not just individual words but 2-to-4-word plain language phrases that precisely describe the work.
- The keywords are used for indexing, abstracting, and retrieval purposes.

5. ABBREVIATION

- Words to be abbreviated should be spelled out in full for the first time they appear in the text, with the abbreviation given in brackets.
- It is preferable to use abbreviations only when the word is used multiple times.

6. INTRODUCTION

- The introductory section should contain a brief review of the problem with which the study deals, validate the approach taken, and formulate the goals.
- The introduction should be general to attract a reader's attention from a wide range of veterinary and medical professional aspects.

7. MATERIALS AND METHODS

- A brief description of the materials used and the methods followed to study the research work should be clearly stated with references.
- Only new methods may be described, but the previously published methods should be cited. However, the essential modifications of published procedures can be mentioned.
- Both the generic and trade names of products, with their manufacturer names, should be added in the manuscript.

8. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

- Results and discussion may be combined or in a separate heading.
- This section should provide a concise description of experimental data obtained, illustrated by tables and figures (which should not duplicate each other).
 - The research findings of the works should be discussed in relation to other published results.
 - The results must be written in the past tense, and the earlier published findings may be written in the present tense.

9. TABLES

- Table(s) should be numbered consecutively in order of citation within the text, with Arabic numerals.
- Each table should have a short title and a legend to facilitate understanding.

10. FIGURES AND PHOTOGRAPHS

- Each figure and photograph must have a caption that briefly describes what is presented, and this caption must be cited within the text of the manuscript.

11. RECOMMENDATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS

- This section should be completed with major recommendations and conclusions that answer the question specified in the introductory part of the article.

12. ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

- The source of any financial support received, or any help taken for analysis, correction of the manuscript or others must be indicated in the acknowledgement section.

13. REFERENCES

- Use numbers for the references in the main text and list them under the References section, starting with the number. Authors bear primary responsibility for the accuracy of all references.
- Only published articles should be incorporated in the references from sources.
- Avoid using conference talks, meetings, abstracts, and proceedings that are not online and that have been submitted for publication should not be cited in the references.
- References must be limited to those that are necessary, and citations should be numbered in the order of their citation with superscript numbers.
- Authors should provide at least one online link or 'doi' number in the references.
- The following is the style used for common types of references.

SUBMISSION, REVIEW, AND PUBLICATION PROCESS

1. You can prepare your paper based on the following template.
2. Email (lepvmbj@gmail.com or vetmebd@yahoo.com) your article to the Editor with a claim that the content is original, and all authors have agreed to publish the paper with authorship mentioned in the article. You can get a notification from the editor confirming the submission.
3. Reviewer's comments will be sent to the authors, and the authors may receive:
 - a. Publish unaltered, b. Minor revision, c. Major revision, and d. Rejection
4. Submit your final article (if required) before the deadline mentioned in the acceptance letter.
5. One line / printed publication would usually be done half-yearly; however, the journal may be published every quarter of the year, depending on the articles received.

ARTICLE -PROCESSING -CHARGE (APC)

- 'JVMOHR' is an open-access veterinary medical professional journal, which is free to access and read on the internet.
- This journal does not have an income from any sources except the authors' contribution.
- To cover the costs of website maintenance, Doi Bangla JOL charges, printing, managing the journal, and processing the manuscript through peer-review and editorial procedure of the journal uses a form of a conditional submission fee referred to as Article Processing Charge (APC).
- **Full-length APC is BDT 2000.0 (Two thousand) for inland authors and US\$50.0 (fifty) only for foreign authors, and BDT 1000.0 (One thousand) and US\$25.0 (twenty five) only for short communication, respectively.**
- APCs are payable for articles upon acceptance of the article.
- The colour photographs are free for website display, but printing charges must be borne in full by the respective author(s).

ONLINE SUBMISSION CHECKLIST

- A. One author should be designated as the corresponding author with contact details:
 - E-mail address
 - Full postal address
- B. All necessary files have been uploaded
- C. Manuscript
 - Include keywords. All figures, including relevant captions
 - All tables, including titles, descriptions, and footnotes
 - Ensure all figure and table citations in the text match the file provided.
 - Manuscript has been 'spell checked' and 'grammar checked' by using USA as per the computer language.
 - All references mentioned in the References list are cited in the text and vice versa.
 - The funding support for the research and article should be acknowledged
 - Authors must submit articles in Microsoft WORD 10 format and not as PDF files.
 - Authors are free to recommend 3-5 potentially relevant reviewers (although there is no guarantee they will be used for peer review).

REVIEW PROCESS AND POLICY

- Your submitted article to 'JVMOHR' means that your work has not been published before in any other journal/book/proceeding (except thesis) and it is also not in way under consideration for publication elsewhere.
- Article submission implies that there is no conflict of interest at any level.

- All research articles will be blind reviewed by at least two anonymous reviewers appointed by the Editor.
- The 'JVMOHR' follows a rapid review system to reduce the time between article submission and subsequent publication.
- The Editor reserves the right to make needed changes in the submitted article at the editing stage.
- Copyrights of published works are retained by the author (s), but first publication rights are granted to 'JVMOHR'.
- In case of any plagiarism issue author(s) hold(s) complete liability.
- The journal aims for a first decision to be made within 6-8 weeks of receipt of the manuscript, and the Editor makes the final decision on publication.
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
